HARD FLOORING

From beautiful parquetry and sumptuous stone to intricately patterned tiles, exciting things are happening underfoot, writes **Georgia Madden**.

here's been an explosion of new, improved hard-flooring products that not only look better than ever but are more versatile and easier to install. Take your pick from sumptuous natural stone, timber floorboards in eye-catching finishes, and porcelain panels that mimic everything from brick to exotic woods.

While there is no shortage of neutrals on offer, it's pattern that's really coming through in flooring right now. Think Moroccan-inspired encaustic (cement) tiles, delicately etched terracotta and graphic-patterned vinyl, all designed to make the floor the star of the room.

At the same time, there's also a renewed appreciation for materials in their natural form, flaws and all, according to Andrea D'Cruz, director of Sydney interior design firm D'Cruz Design Group. "We're embracing the veining in stone, and the knots and grains in timber," she says. "Inherent texture is now being favoured over highly lacquered surfaces."

WHAT TO CONSIDER

A new floor is a huge investment so it pays to consider your options carefully. Michael Karakolis, founder and managing director of Fibonacci Stone, offers this advice:

- + Flooring is a long-term decision. Select a colour that will support you as your style evolves, and a material that will age gracefully.
- + A dark floor will create a cosy, intimate ambience; a light one will make a room feel fresh and spacious.
- + When it comes to light-coloured floors, those with a hint of grey or cream will be more forgiving.
- ♣ Be realistic about how much maintenance you are prepared to do and choose a type of flooring to suit.
- + For longevity and ease of care, avoid high-gloss finishes, stark whites and extremely hard materials that can't be repaired when scratched.
- + Factor installation costs into your budget.

 Ceramic tiles are a great choice if you're looking for a tough, easy-care floor but need to stick to a tight budget. "Matt and semi-polished finishes are still trending, and as for colour it's all about grey, from the lightest dove grey to the darkest charcoal," says Julie McLellan, tile and rug product manager at Choices Flooring.

The latest tiles can give you the look of solid timber or stone for a fraction of the price. "Tile-printing technology is now so sophisticated that any look can be achieved, and the tile is almost indistinguishable from the material it's mimicking," says Marita Blaschka, design director at Tile MegaMart. Size-wise, tiles are getting larger, as much as 1200x1200mm.

For flooring that's rich in character and improves with age, natural stone such as bluestone or travertine is hard to beat. It can also create a seamless indoor-outdoor look. "Natural stone has a greater sense of depth and colour variation than tiles and timber, while being forgiving in terms of wear, tear and stains," says Jen Stumbles, co-owner of Eco Outdoor. Stone is easy to clean but, being naturally porous, will require regular sealing.

Another classic treatment is timber flooring, which has warm, natural appeal and can be renewed countless times. The latest trends see us moving away from reddish tones and towards sophisticated shades of grey, according to Anne Plumb, general manager at Harper & Sandilands.

"Parquetry flooring is also having a resurgence," says Leon Travis, national sales and distribution manager for hardwoods at Boral Timber. "The use of different lines. colours and shapes such as herringbone and geometrics creates visual depth and adds another dimension to interiors."

For an eco-friendly option, consider bamboo flooring. "Bamboo is highly renewable, plus it's more impact-resistant than timber, making it a popular choice for families," says Emma Bolger, brand communications manager at Choices Flooring. On the downside, bamboo is unsuitable for wet rooms or outdoor use.

Engineered timber, which usually features a thin laver of timber bonded to a high-density substrate, is fast to install and can be laid straight over existing floors. Sydney interior designer Alexandra Kidd is excited about its potential. "Our love affair with wide timber floorboards continues. Engineered timber boards can be as wide as 400mm," she says. "We're also spoilt for choice with colours, with everything on offer from soft greys and whitewashes to dark chocolate and black."

Meanwhile, new-generation vinyls and laminates have shaken off their daggy image. They come in a huge range of finishes that offer not just the look but the texture of exotic timbers, stone, slate and concrete. The latest styles are easy to install, budget-friendly and eco-conscious. They are much more versatile, too; laminate flooring, for example, was once limited to moisture-free rooms but with developments such as Quick-Step's waterproof Impressive Ultra technology. it can now be used in bathrooms and laundries.

A cost-effective brush-up for timber flooring

"It's possible to breath fresh life into existing timber Justices and seek as specialist coating. According to James Fisher, brand manager at Feast Watson, grey, black and bright white are the go-to shades right now. "Also emerging is the use of startols and patterns—everything from abstract shapes to lace effects." For best results, he says, proper preparation and technique are vital: \$\int \text{Sand the surface and vacuum away all dust before coating.}

- coat across multiple boards. For longevity and durability, apply a minimum of three coats. Always ensure your final brush or applicator stroke follows the direction of the grain.
